











INTRODUCTION

In Activity Sheet #3, you will learn about what cities are doing to address the winter blues. You will also get a chance to come up with recommendations to make your city more winter-friendly.

This section will help you learn about what a winter city is and what challenges it faces during the winter months.

What is a winter city?

A winter city is typically defined as an urban centre that experiences long periods of temperature below 0 degree celsius throughout the year. During the winter months, these cities experience large amounts of snowfall and limited access to sunshine and daylight.

What are winter city principles?

The climate and weather of winter cities result in harsh conditions where dwellers need to adjust their behaviours and lifestyles to cope with. For example, people in winter cities tend to spend more time indoors and become less active during the cold and dark seasons. Consequently, winter city principles refer to a series of guidelines or recommendations that aims to improve resident's quality of life during the winter season by addressing issues such as cold temperatures, snow, ice, limited daylight, and other winter-related challenges. Some examples of winter city principles include snow management, winter lighting, active transportation, and winter cultural events.

By the end of this activity, you should be able to come up with your definition of a winter city and recommendations that will make your city more winter-friendly.













02 DISCUSSION

Discuss within your team to reflect upon how it's like to live in a winter city. Go through the guiding questions and come up with your own definition of winter city. 20 minutes

Guiding questions

- What do you like about winter? What do you not like about winter?
- What is it like to live in a winter city?
- What are some things you can only do in winter?
- What are some challenges you have experienced during winter?
 - What do you find unique about your career field?
 - Do you think any of these challenges may affect certain populations more severely than others?
 - Do you think any of these challenges may affect certain locations in your city more severely than others?
 - Which of these challenges can be solved in the short-term (within a year)? Which of these challenges can be solved in the long-term (over multiple years)?
- Do you recall any responses from the local government regarding undesirable winter conditions such as snow removal or signage? Which of these responses do you consider useful?
- What is the ideal winter city you envision?

- Slides 4 to 6: Come up with 3 recommendations that will either 1) tackle the challenges you identified in previous steps, or 2) celebrate the opportunities in your city during winter months.
